CP-17-2296 African Arts Academy <i>San Francisco County</i> \$18,000	This proposal requests \$20,000 to support African Arts Academy, a non-profit art organization whose mission is to teach arts and crafts originating in Africa and the African diaspora. The funding will help establish regular dance and music classes that is deeply rooted in the black community of San Francisco. Fund will also help produce concerts showcasing African immigrant artists of the bay area, featuring their original work, in San Francisco.

<p>CP-17-2018 Dance Studio Showtime - Katusha <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$8,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, DANCE STUDIO SHOWTIME - KATUSHA will open new part-time administrative position, as well as pay professional performers fee; will make our events more accessible to the public by making them low cost or totally free.</p>

<p>CP-17-2282 Dohee Lee Puri Arts <i>Alameda County</i> \$20,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Dohee Lee Puri Arts will strengthen the capacity of our emerging arts organization to implement an award from the Hewlett Foundation, scaling out our pilot program over the next two years – a community performance project working with East Oakland immigrant and refugee groups. We need increased organizational funding to manage this ambitious work and create a sustainable future for our organization.</p>
<p>CP-17-1750 Festival of Latin American Contemporary Choreographers <i>San Francisco County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With support of the California Arts Council, the Festival of Latin American Contemporary Choreographers will enhance its stability and efficiency, and gain crucial skills via the Cultural Pathways program.</p>

These annual events are instrumental in educating our students and community members in cultural identity and awareness.</p>
<p>CP-17-2012 Hanford Multicultural Theater Company <i>Kings County</i> \$10,016</p>	<p>With the support from the California Arts Council, Hanford Multicultural Theater Company (HMTc) will flourish in a highly diverse community as the first and only multicultural theatrical arts organization in the area. HMTc will use the Pathway funds for professional development with the goal to be a successful and long-lasting entity that offers an invitation for the community to participate and see their experiences on a stage in an all-inclusive environment.</p>

<p>CP-17-2405 Indian Performing Art Center <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$13,860</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Indian Performing Art Center will support a series of public showcases—from traditionally intimate encounters to large-scale pieces for the concert stage—featuring the live collaboration between classical Kathak dancers and Hindustani musicians. These intergenerational shows will highlight the collaborative improvisation of expressive storytelling, mathematical footwork, and rhythmic call-and-response that defines classical performance.</p>
<p>CP-17-2273 Indigenous Circles United Inc <i>Colusa County</i> \$5,250</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, INDIGENOUS CIRCLES UNITED INC will expand our Cultural programming, with the objective to help at risk Indigenous youth by growing the reach of our Cultural Presentations and activities. The objective is to reduce the many risk these youth face by exposing them to Culture. Funding in the amount of \$20,000 is requested for traveling expenses, administrative expenses, cost of materials, scholarship fund, Honorariums, and follow up services.</p>
<p>CP-17-2401 Inlandia Institute <i>Riverside County</i> \$14,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Inlandia Institute will formally partner with Glocally Connected to replicate and expand existing arts programs for incoming refugee families, specifically women and children, working to achieve English language proficiency and support their integration into the local community as well as a more focused effort on their mental well-being. As one student said, “we’re all damaged because we were raised in a country where there has always been war.”</p>

<p>CP-17-1723 La Ultima Parada <i>Santa Clara County</i> \$20,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, La Ultima Parada will strengthen its ability to educate, engage, and honor the cultural tradition of Dia de los Muertos and develop a culturally significant and recognized community in the low-income, underserved, primarily Latino Mayfair neighborhood of East San Jose.</p>

<p>CP-17-2493 Lacustre Michoacan De Ocampo <i>Sacramento County</i> \$3,375</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Lacustre Michoacan de Ocampo will expand our repertoire by 2 new dances, we will replace our 12 worn out costumes, we will reconstruct the Toro de Petate, we will expand our group with 5 new members and we will strengthen our internal operations with CAC run workshops.</p>
<p>CP-17-1696 Makara Center for the Arts <i>Orange County</i> \$16,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, MAKARA CENTER FOR THE ARTS will expand its specialized library services, serve as a resource center and hub for local artists, and develop impactful and engaging programs for Santa Ana communities.</p>
<p>CP-17-2473 Malaya Filipino American Dance Arts <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$16,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Malaya Filipino American Dance Arts will stimulate the growth of its artistic programming for the Filipino American community in Los Angeles. The funds will help advance the Board and leadership's training for fund development and long term programming. Malaya also will use the grant to increase its marketing tools for outreach and to broaden its scope with the Filipino American community.</p>
<p>CP-17-2465 Mexican Cultural Institute of Los Angeles Inc <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$16,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Mexican Cultural Institute of Los Angeles, Inc. will provide programming and events which promote the contribution of Mexican culture to the Chicano diaspora and the larger cultural landscape of the United States. It is our hope that through the art and cultural events and activities presented by the Mexican Cultural institute, more people will have a greater awareness of their own selves, our culture, and the influences upon their lives.</p>
<p>CP-17-2070 Music Mission San Francisco <i>San Francisco County</i> \$12,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Music Mission San Francisco (MMSF) will add one new music teaching position to the artistic staff (\$6000 per year over a two year period). This new position will allow MMSF to enroll 10-15 additional students. Many families in the community have already expressed an interest in joining the program and we currently have 17 children on our waiting list; however, we cannot accommodate them without adding another teaching position.</p>
<p>CP-17-2476 Nava Dance Theatre <i>Contra Costa County</i> \$16,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, NAVA DANCE THEATRE will be able to build capacity within the artistic community among women and people of color by supporting artistic personnel and creative consultants. We will provide access to the arts by improving our reach through public relations. We will also use the funds to contract a movement coach/dramaturg who will help us evaluate choreography and movement to understand how they might affect people across cultures.</p>
<p>CP-17-2412 Octenate /Souly Dance Arts <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Souly Dance Arts can pay for administrative assistance for our education and performance programs highlighting the culture of the Mande diaspora in the Los Angeles Area. We will offer free dance classes in Jefferson Park; continue residencies at public schools in the City of Santa Monica and Orange County; create work for the Africa in America Showcase; provide support to elders/traditionalists on artists' profiles; produce Djanjoba Festival.</p>

<p>CP-17-2409 One Myanmar Community Inc <i>Alameda County</i> \$14,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, ONE MYANMAR COMMUNITY INC will be able to provide more language and cultural classes promote and spread Arts and Cultural from Myanmar. Currently, we are volunteer based and aiming to hire a part-time staff member at our Community Center to be effectively manage the Art and Cultural Programs. The grant funds will be used to collaborate with other organizations focusing on promoting our culture.</p>
<p>CP-17-2184 Panamanian International Film Festival <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Panamanian International Film Festival will endeavor to build on the success of 2017's PanaFest event, which included films, industry panels, arts exhibits and musical performances, by increasing its paid staff, augmenting audience development efforts and educational initiatives while focusing greater resources on fundraising and industry alliances. Greater funding will expand potential benefits offered to participants such as awards and travel.</p>
<p>CP-17-2335 Parangal Dance Company <i>San Mateo County</i> \$11,700</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Parangal Dance Company will expand our arts advocacy work by producing Padayon, our tenth anniversary show showcasing cultural dance pieces from overlooked and underrepresented indigenous groups in the Philippines. We are seeking funding for renting our venue, marketing collateral, art supplies, costumes, props, and instruments. We will then be able to make use of our earnings and supplies we have for performances and tours during the next year.</p>
<p>CP-17-1717 Performing Arts for Life and Education Foundation <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$16,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, The Performing Arts for Life and Education Foundation will expand its theatre arts training programs to serve more young people and to launch its new senior theatre arts training program. PALEF is completing its 2017 to 2022 Strategic Plan and a portion of the CAC Funds will be used to assist the organization in strengthening its organizational infrastructure.</p>
<p>CP-17-1466 Q Youth Foundation Inc <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$4,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Q YOUTH FOUNDATION INC will used the funds to continue the writing workshop fellowship, launching the Director's Workshop and the Writing Labs for 2018-2019. This includes paying for the facilitators, providing community talks with LGBTQIA+ community leaders open to all community members - hosting two community readings and a directors recital for the work developed at the writing workshops.</p>
<p>CP-17-2109 Raizes Collective <i>Sonoma County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, RAIZES COLLECTIVE will increase internal capacity by hiring paid Executive Director to provide leadership: She will lead our vision, identify and secure resources, ensure a solid financial foundation, increase partners and allies, engage in forward thinking and strategic planning to meet current & emerging needs, provide platforms for our community of color to express struggles, joys, pride, strength and vision for the world through the arts.</p>
<p>CP-17-2183 Renaissance Institute Of Music <i>San Diego County</i> \$20,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, RENAISSANCE INSTITUTE OF MUSIC will provide instruments and music instruction to local students ages 7 to adult, with the goal to empower them to perform together in leveled musical ensembles created in order to share their music with the wider community in local performance venues. RIOM will also provide Teaching Artist training to more advanced students to enable them to be mentors, teachers, and leaders in the ensembles.</p>

We will build on the positive momentum of our past site-specific work to develop new shows with a big impact to expand our artist base and audiences exponentially.</p>
<p>CP-17-2247 Sambafunk <i>Alameda County</i> \$20,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, SambaFunk! will 1) hire a part-time Executive Director 2) fund a professional Grantwriter, and 3) pay our volunteer Social Media Manager to fully develop a social media program. CAC funds will transform our new and rapidly growing arts organization into a cultural anchor which will significantly expand our access to people of color and traditionally underserved low income communities of color in Oakland and throughout the San Francisco Bay Area.</p>
<p>CP-17-2328 San Francisco Bay Area Theatre Company <i>San Francisco County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With the support from the California Arts Council, San Francisco Bay Area Theatre Company will provide a small stipend to both full time staff members, Rodney Earl Jackson Jr. & Marcelo Javier Pereira, who currently volunteer their time to steering this organization. By funding these staff members, CAC will help to begin restructuring this organization from one that is volunteer based into one that properly compensates full time staff for services rendered.</p>
<p>CP-17-2284 Sarah Webster Fabio Center for Social Justice <i>Alameda County</i> \$16,000</p>	<p>"With support from the California Arts Council, SARAH WEBSTER FABIO CENTER FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE will devote resources and attention to our organizational structure including building and developing our board of directors; defining a Development strategy, exploring donor recruitment campaign and refining our brand. By the end of the 2nd year SWFCenter will be able to initiate its first Strategic Plan.</p>
<p>CP-17-2505 Seventh Native American Generation - Snag Magazine <i>San Francisco County</i> \$10,000</p>	<p>With the support of the California Arts Council's Cultural Pathways Program, Seventh Native American Generation – SNAG Magazine will offer more open community and after-school workshops in journalism, multi-media art, screen printing, audio and video production, murals, digital photography, and magazine layout and design for Indigenous Youth in the Bay Area, Sonoma County, and outreach to rural reservations.</p>
<p>CP-17-2433 Silicon Valley African Film Festival <i>Santa Clara County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, SILICON VALLEY AFRICAN FILM FESTIVAL will professionalize our backend staffing by hiring a part time office manager who will serve as a steady engine of our operations and ensure sustainability. The office manager will be responsible for coordinating meetings of our various project teams, managing our film library, coordinating our grants and funder reports, daily office administrative tasks and duties.</p>
<p>CP-17-2419 The Singing Bois <i>San Francisco County</i> \$9,825</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, The Singing Bois will continue the work of creating space and artistic opportunity for Trans, Gender Non-Conforming/Non-Binary, Masculine of Center and artists of color.</p>

<p>CP-17-2325 Support For Intertribal Gatherings <i>San Francisco County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With this grant from the California Arts Council, Support for Intertribal Gatherings will train and develop the leadership of two emerging California tribal artists, Kanyon Sayers Roods, Mutsen Ohlone, and Miye Tom, Pomo and Piute. These emerging artists will be supported by elder, Mary Jean Robertson, Cherokee. Mary Jean has co-led the organization for 8 years. We will continue to produce our annual summer culture camp and our Big Time dance gathering in the fall.</p>
<p>CP-17-2330 Unsung Heroes Living History Project <i>Sacramento County</i> \$16,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Unsung Heroes Living History Project will be able to obtain professional development opportunities in strategic planning and program implementation; program evaluation; arts presentation, and nonprofit financial management.</p>
<p>CP-17-2463 Visibility Project <i>Alameda County</i> \$16,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Visibility Project will collect and disseminate histories of the LGBTQ APA communities through the Resilience Archives. We provide education opportunities and archiving services. We curate and digitize materials, attain publishing permission, and post key materials in an online digital history tour. We offer free storytelling workshops that highlight LGBTQ APA experiences, and present work in a powerful performance and visual arts showcase.</p>
<p>CP-17-2049 Washington Neighborhood Center <i>Sacramento County</i> \$4,160</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Washington Neighborhood Center will be able to operate our Center more effectively. The funding would ease the stress of constantly pushing all efforts to make bill payments and pay taxes. Utilities are generally underpaid every month and this grant would assist the Center in paying these. It would allow the board to continue to our partnerships with the many organizations that utilize our building for FREE public arts and cultural programming.</p>
<p>CP-17-2491 Watsonville Film Festival <i>Santa Cruz County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Watsonville Film Festival will be able to implement key elements of our three year strategic plan to hit our goals for growth in order to have several paid staff, a on-going program, and a more solid and consistent volunteer and donor engagement process.</p>
<p>CP-17-2014 Young Choreographers Project <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$17,100</p>	<p>With the support from the California Arts Council, YOUNG CHOREOGRAPHERS PROJECT will provide choreography and mentoring programming to young people living in the inner-city of Los Angeles. Participants will receive one-on-one coaching and group instruction in choreography and leadership. Coaching and instruction will be provided by some of LA's top professional dancers. Programming will end with a showcase, where participants will present their work to friends, family, & community members.</p>
