AE-EXP-18-5466 <b>24TH STREET THEATRE COMPANY</b> <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$16,200	With support from the California Arts Council, 24th Street Theatre Company will provide 10 school field trips to see Enter Stage Right, a live theatrical production about the inner workings of theater and theatrical productions and 20 supporting pre- and post-field trip classroom education workshops extending the learning experience. Approximately 1,000 K-5 students will benefit from these arts education packages which align with California Visual and Performing Arts Standards.
AE-EXP-18-5520 <b>A REASON TO SURVIVE</b> <i>San Diego County</i> \$17,125	With the support from the California Art Council, A Reason to Survive will collaborate with teaching artists from Blindspot Collective to offer a series of three immersive theatre pieces to 50 elementary and secondary school students across the South Bay region of San Diego. The communities served lack regular access to high-quality artistic performances and educational opportunities, especially those that reflect the cultures and storylines in the communities where these work will be performed.

The goal is to provide opportunity for under-served students to engage in theatre and other art forms in their community that support and deepen their understanding of the creative process and how it relates to them.

Kala will bring children and youth from local schools to Kala for a half day field trip that includes a tour of the Kala Printmaking and Media Center, observation and discussion with activities in the Kala gallery, and a hands-on art making activity in the Community Classroom.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5184 <b>AFRICAN-AMERICAN SHAKESPEARE COMPANY</b> <i>San Francisco County</i> \$16,200</p>	<p>With support from the CAC, African-American Shakespeare Company will provide 3,148 students from various public schools throughout the greater Bay Area to attend our free student matinee performances for our 2019-20 season. The Season includes a re-imagining version of Othello as Muslim marrying a Christian; holiday performance of Cinderella; Noel Coward's Private Lives re-interpreted in the Harlem Renaissance era; and Henry V, where the struggle for power translates into a fight for turf.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5242 <b>AMERICAN CONSERVATORY THEATRE FOUNDATION</b> <i>San Francisco County</i> \$14,400</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, A.C.T. will continue reaching underserved schools with Will on Wheels (WOW), our tour of abridged Shakespeare productions performed by A.C.T.'s Master of Fine Arts Program students. Each show includes pre- and post-show workshops led by professional teaching artists. The 2019-20 tour is scheduled to reach a minimum 15 schools and community groups in the Bay Area. This year's production is A Midsummer's Night Dream.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-4918 <b>ARMORY CENTER FOR THE ARTS</b> <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Armory Center for the Arts will implement My Masterpieces: Discovering Art in My Community, a field trip program in partnership with the Pasadena Unified School District. The program includes 40 two-hour field trips to the Armory's contemporary art galleries, followed by a hands-on artmaking experience, serving 5th grade students attending Title I schools in the district.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-4298 <b>ARTS &amp; LEARNING CORPORATION</b> <i>Orange County</i> \$14,400</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Arts &amp; Learning Conservatory will pay teaching artists for After School Arts Program assemblies to promote and recruit for year-round performing arts class instruction in disadvantaged K-6 schools. The student-interactive assemblies are educational mini-concerts that promote instrumental music awareness by introducing students to the orchestra's instrument families. A curriculum guide with targeted learning activities will be provided to teachers.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5396 <b>ARTS AND SERVICES FOR DISABLED INCORPORATED</b> <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$14,384</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Able Arts Work will expand opportunities for 700 underserved elementary students by offering participation in our Learn Exhibit Arts Field trip (LEAF) project. The field trip will take place at the Cypress College Art Gallery during school hours. Students will be exposed to professional artwork, learn how to critique art, and receive a professional art lesson. The LEAF project cultivates, educates, and engages students' relationship with art.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5387 <b>ARTS FOR THE SCHOOLS</b> <i>Nevada County</i> \$14,400</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Arts for the Schools will provide performing arts assemblies and master classes for 11 rural schools, reaching 9,000 students. Learning will be extended with study guides provided to and taught by classroom teachers.</p>

<p>AE-EXP-18-5192 <b>BLUE LINE ARTS</b> <i>Placer County</i> \$14,400</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Blue Line Arts will expand our Tour Talk &amp; Create program, bringing students from underserved Placer County schools to participate in a guided interactive tour of our contemporary art gallery, incorporating analysis, Visual Thinking Strategies, and a hands-on art activity led by professional teaching artists. Students will be exposed to By Hand, an international show, and The US Show, which celebrates diversity by featuring immigrant artists.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5330 <b>BROCKUS PROJECT DANCE COMPANY</b> <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$12,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Brockus Project Dance Company will provide 400 students at four schools a free field trip program, "Jobs in the Arts," which will include exposure to two high-level dance concerts by California Artists for students in two different theaters, facility tours, and pre- and post-workshops on the many jobs that occur in behind the scenes to make a live production occur, creating a pipeline for increasing diversity in the ecosystem of dance on stage in crews and in arts administration.</p>

The project will be in conjunction with the TRSD district and the Luther Burbank Theater in Santa Rosa and will feature exuberant dances, live musicians, a school study guide for teachers, educational lecture with students and director and a dance workshop for students.</p>

Our work will support ongoing efforts to advance music programs and create opportunities to experience the transformative power of live classical music. Our activities will inspire meaningful connections that encourage, acknowledge, and respectfully engage all students and cultures.</p>

Through participation and interaction with master Teaching Artists, students will experience world music and dance, gaining beneficial knowledge about world geography, history, cultures, languages, and traditions.</p>

The program, which is experiencing pressing demand, includes pre- and post-tour supporting classroom curriculum, docent-led tours, a related hands-on art project, and a two-day teacher workshop.</p>

<p>AE-EXP-18-5155 <b>CORPORATION OF THE FINE ARTS MUSEUMS</b> <i>San Francisco County</i> \$16,200</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Fine Arts Museums (FAMSF) will provide its Get Smart with Art (GSWA) program to 6,000 underserved Bay Area students. GSWA is an interdisciplinary curriculum package that uses art objects as primary documents, sparking investigations into the diverse cultures represented by FAMSF’s collections. The program includes free curriculum materials, with preparatory lessons, a guided tour in the museums’ galleries, and a thematic art activity.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5332 <b>CRAFT AND FOLK ART MUSEUM INCORPORATING THE EGG AND THE EYE</b> <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$16,200</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Craft and Folk Art Museum Incorporating the Egg and the Eye will provide arts education via standards- based guided museum exhibition tours, hands-on workshops and pre-visit classroom materials for underserved K-12 classrooms in LAUSD.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5207 <b>CRE OUTREACH FOUNDATION INC</b> <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$4,000</p>	<p>With support from the CAC, CRE Outreach will offer The Butterfly Effect assembly to schools across LA County. The assembly will be conducted by professional teaching artists and will feature blind actors from CRE’s signature program, Theatre by the Blind. Students will learn how the performing arts can help visually impaired individuals push the limits of their disability. The assembly will facilitate interaction between students and blind actors and introduce them to theatre techniques.</p>

Through studio tours, CE artist talks and presentations, and art-making activities in collaboration with CE artists, students will learn about the art-making process of artists with developmental disabilities and engage in the creative dialogue through their own artwork.</p>

CBT’s program activities offer students opportunities to see live performances and engage with professional artists. These organizations are unable to provide these opportunities without CBT programming.</p>

The 2019 international cast will bring a unique holiday show with comedy, original music, and a message of hope to rural, remote, and underserved communities for free.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-4391 <b>DIVERSIONARY THEATRE PRODUCTIONS INC</b> <i>San Diego County</i> \$9,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Diversionary will offer Student Matinees to Middle and High Schools students, along with pre- and post-show in-classroom workshops to help the students better understand the stories they encounter on our stage and tie them back to their own lives. This program is 100% free and annually reaches over 500 students with little-to-no access to the arts, instilling cross-cultural tolerance around our LGBT mission, and an appreciation for live theater.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-4453 <b>EAST BAY CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS</b> <i>Contra Costa County</i> \$16,200</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, East Bay Center for the Performing Arts will provide 4,000 low-income Title I West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD) students in grades 4-12 with relevant assemblies in West African Music and Dance, Folkloric Mexican Music and Dance, and Jazz and Democracy.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5445 <b>EAST-WEST PLAYERS INC</b> <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$16,200</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, East West Players will commission, cast, stage, and produce a play for students in grades 6-12 through its Theatre for Youth Touring Production. The Touring Production will be performed for 11,000 students at 25 schools and community centers across Southern California.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5317 <b>FOUNDATION FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS CENTER</b> <i>San Luis Obispo County</i> \$16,200</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Foundation for the Performing Arts Center will provide access to high-quality performing arts experiences to more than 17,000 students in the 2019-2020 season through the School Matinee Program and the Poly Arts for Youth Program. More than 12,000 students will attend free School Matinee performances and an additional 5,000 students will participate in free in-school arts education outreach and enrichment programs through Poly Arts for Youth.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5464 <b>FRESNO PHILHARMONIC ASSOCIATION</b> <i>Fresno County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Fresno Philharmonic will present the Link Up music education program, developed by Carnegie Hall's Weill Music Institute, to over 11,500 students (74% of whom attend Title I elementary schools) during the 2019-20 school year. The program provides students in grades 3-5 with a high quality, standards-based curriculum for recorder and voice and prepares them to perform with the Fresno Philharmonic in one of six interactive culminating concerts.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5300 <b>FRIENDS OF OLYMPIA STATION INC</b> <i>Santa Cruz County</i> \$16,200</p>	<p>With support from the CAC, Tandy Beal &amp; Co will produce ArtSmart tours of excellent Bay Area artists in world music, world dance and circus in three Central Coast counties (Watsonville, Salinas, Santa Cruz, Seaside, Marina, Hollister, King City). To provide maximum exposure for schools with limited access to the arts, concerts are in both theaters and schools, with unique pre-concert study guides for teachers, online evaluations re VAPA learning benchmarks, and CEUs for enrolled, participating teachers.</p>

<p>AE-EXP-18-4586 <b>GALLO CENTER FOR THE ARTS INC</b> <i>Stanislaus County</i> \$14,400</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Gallo Center for the Arts will provide 250 4<sup>th</sup> grade students from Patterson, California with an in-classroom reader’s theater workshop; admission to the Gallo Center’s performance of “Children of the Dust Bowl,” including transportation; and a post-show talkback with the cast and crew from the performance.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5438 <b>GEFFEN PLAYHOUSE INC</b> <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$16,200</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Geffen Playhouse will give high school youth who have no other access to the arts and are living in some of the most destitute neighborhoods of Los Angeles a season-long immersive experience in theater arts that will awaken their appreciation of the arts as a great resource in the lives and will take their critical thinking skills, creativity and self-expression, confidence and their ability to empathize and connect with others to new heights.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-4196 <b>GOLDEN VALLEY MUSIC SOCIETY INC</b> <i>Riverside County</i> \$8,745</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Golden Valley Music Society Inc, with the Academy of Ballet Arts, will present three live theater performances of “Tchaikovsky’s Fantastic Ballets” to all (about 1,500) Murrieta School District 4<sup>th</sup> grade students. The program presents highlights of classical favorites “Swan Lake,” “The Sleeping Beauty” and “The Nutcracker” in an aurally and visually engaging fashion. Grant funds will pay for professional musicians and dance coaches/choreographers.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-4321 <b>GRAND VISION FOUNDATION</b> <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Grand Vision Foundation staff and teaching artists will provide arts integration professional development sessions for up to 60 classroom teachers annually who participate in its Meet the Music programs in L.A. Harbor area Title I elementary schools. Empowered by arts integration training, classroom teachers connect Meet the Music curriculum to other core subjects, helping learning come to life.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5196 <b>HUMBOLDT STATE UNIVERSITY SPONSORED PROGRAMS FOUNDATION</b> <i>Humboldt County</i> \$6,347</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Humboldt State University Sponsored Programs Foundation, in partnership with Humboldt State University’s Art Department, will bus 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade students and teachers from aesthetically underserved Humboldt County elementary schools to visit local museums and galleries, where they will view and discuss contemporary artworks, interact with invited artists, and engage in arts curriculum developed and taught by HSU’s undergraduate Art Education majors.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5405 <b>INNER-CITY ARTS</b> <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$14,400</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Inner-City Arts will present four professional, culturally diverse performances in theater, music, puppetry, and dance at our state-of-the-art Rosenthal Theater, serving 5,000 K-8 students from 23 Title I schools. Performances will include a pre-show art workshop and post-show conversations, as facilitated by a study guide—supporting students’ learning, positive self-identification, and an appreciation of the performing arts.</p>

<p>AE-EXP-18-5489 <b>INTREPID SHAKESPEARE COMPANY</b> <i>San Diego County</i> \$16,173</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Intrepid Theatre Company will create 12 student matinee performances of August Wilson’s Joe Turner’s Come and Gone during the run of the Season Eight production. Intrepid will partner with 12 San Diego high schools who will attend the matinees and send teaching artists into these schools to facilitate interactive workshops ahead of their experience of the play. After the performances, students will engage in post-show conversations with the actors.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5240 <b>INYO COUNCIL FOR THE ARTS</b> <i>Inyo County</i> \$14,400</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Inyo Council for the Arts will collaborate with the Inyo County Superintendent of Schools office to provide artistic and cultural experiences to students in grades PK-12 in our extremely rural and remote socio-economically disadvantaged county. This will include a variety of culturally rich, high-quality, and hands-on arts experiences, guiding students to develop an appreciation and deep personal connection with the arts.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-4434 <b>KALEIDOSCOPE CHAMBER ORCHESTRA</b> <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$18,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Kaleidoscope Chamber Orchestra will present free performances of Prokofiev’s Peter and the Wolf to five Title I elementary schools in the Los Angeles area. Every performance will be narrated in English and Spanish. KCO will provide a curriculum for teachers to use prior to the concert, lead an interactive lesson from the stage, and host an instrument petting zoo after the performance in which students will have the opportunity to try instruments.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-4690 <b>LAGUNA ART MUSEUM</b> <i>Orange County</i> \$10,102</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Laguna Art Museum will expose 450 4<sup>th</sup> grade students from Santa Ana with a three-part art education experience: 1) A museum docent visits classrooms, introducing the museum and the three exhibitions on view; 2) the entire 4<sup>th</sup> grade level visits the museum with a tour of the museum; and 3) a teaching artist visits the classrooms and facilitates an art lesson and art-making activity.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-18-5373 <b>LIBERTY PAINTING CORP</b> <i>Siskiyou County</i> \$11,000</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Liberty Painting Corp will offer arts education opportunities to students residing in Siskiyou County through the gallery’s Explorations program. Class visits are structured using the Visual and Performing Arts Framework for California Public Schools K- 12, and follow the definition of an advance comprehensive art program. Funding will support educator salaries, art materials, insurance and facility overhead for approximately 1,000 student visits.</p>
