AIT-19-6089 Arts Integration Training ACTORS GANG INC <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$2,500	With support from the California Arts Council, The Actors' Gang will conduct teacher training and instruction in our signature style of theater to explore the themes of the subject the students are studying in the classroom.
AIT-19-5481 Arts Integration Training ALONZO KING LINES BALLE <i>San Francisco County</i> \$2,500	With support from the California Arts Council, Alonzo King LINES Ballet will host three professional development trainings for educators at participating HeART with LINES partner schools in San Francisco and Berkeley Unified School Districts, with participation from all HeART with LINES Teaching Artists. Trainings will cover arts integration curriculum building and program assessment that meet SFUSD's Arts Education Master Plan goals and Common Core and VAPA standards.

AGCC has provided students in the L.A. Harbor Region with high-quality arts education since 1999. CAC’s AIT funding would help AGCC provide 50 teachers with a one-day training program.</p>
<p>AIT-19-5644 Arts Integration Training ARTS COLLABORATIVE OF NEVADA COUNTY <i>Nevada County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Arts Collaborative of Nevada County (NCArts) will assist local schools in the development/delivery of model arts lessons integrating common core standards in math, science, ELA and H/SS and California’s new VAPA standards by: 1) bringing 5th grade classroom teachers and Teaching Artists together for a series of meetings to create 23 model lessons for 5th grade; 2) Providing countywide trainings for classroom teachers to teach the lessons.</p>

The Summer Arts Institute is an opportunity for non-arts classroom teachers to learn how to use visual arts, music, dance and drama to teach Common Core subjects such as math, English and science.</p>

Teachers will go through the curriculum themselves, create art and accompanying story, and learn best practices about teaching it to their students.</p>
<p>AIT-19-4783 Arts Integration Training BAY AREA CHILDRENS THEATRE <i>Alameda County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Bay Area Children’s Theatre will provide its Literature to Life Professional Development Program at Mission San Jose Elementary to help educators bring the arts into their classrooms as discrete art forms as well as integrate the performing arts into all other subjects. Over the course of the school year, the program will provide six workshops (three all-school and three grade-level specific) to each teacher.</p>

<p>AIT-19-5883 Arts Integration Training COTA COLLABORATIONS TEACHERS AND ARTISTS <i>San Diego County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, CoTA will offer the STEAM Institute, a four-day professional development tool for teachers in the Chula Vista Elementary School District, providing an opportunity for teachers to see how the arts can be used to support student learning in science (Next Generation Science Standards). Workshops are designed to engage teachers in the investigation of science through dance, theater and visual arts.</p>
<p>AIT-19-4454 Arts Integration Training EAST BAY CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS <i>Contra Costa County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, East Bay Center for the Performing Arts will partner with West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD) to provide professional development services in arts integration to WCCUSD elementary school teachers and principals, focusing on King, Nystrom, Stege, and Wilson Elementary Schools.</p>
<p>AIT-19-4482 Arts Integration Training GRAND VISION FOUNDATION <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Grand Vision Foundation will provide robust professional development sessions for up to 60 classroom teachers annually who participate in its Meet the Music programs in eight local Title I elementary schools. Empowered by arts integration training, classroom teachers connect Meet the Music curriculum to other core subjects, helping learning come to life.</p>

Teachers will learn to utilize interdisciplinary theater techniques that will enhance student exploration and expression of social and political topics related to Biology, History, Government, or Economics.</p>

<p>AIT-19-5742 Arts Integration Training LUNA KIDS DANCE INC <i>Alameda County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Luna Dance Institute will provide arts integration training via its School & Community Alliance (SCA) program in Oakland Unified School district to build sustainable dance education programs at three school sites. Teaching artists will partner with classroom teachers in a side-by-side professional development (PD) model which includes these activities: weekly model dance classes, on-site in-services and off-site PD workshops, and coaching.</p>
<p>AIT-19-6067 Arts Integration Training OUTSIDE THE LENS <i>San Diego County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Outside the Lens will provide two media arts integration professional development sessions for elementary educators in Chula Vista. The Cameras in Classrooms Arts Integration Workshop will explore the language of visual art and project design so that teachers feel confident integrating media arts into their curriculum. Workshops will address English Language Arts, Math, and Science standards alongside VAPA and NCA standards.</p>
<p>AIT-19-5891 Arts Integration Training PERALTA PARENT GROUP INC <i>Alameda County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the PPTG will support Arts Integration Specialist Trena Noval to plan and deliver professional development in arts integration strategies to teachers through a series of professional development workshops at Peralta that align with Alameda County Office of Education Arts Centered Integrated Learning goals for ACOE Demonstration Sites (Peralta is an ACOE Arts Demonstration Site) and OUSD VAPA goals for whole-school arts integration across curriculum.</p>
<p>AIT-19-5951 Arts Integration Training PERFORMING ARTS CENTER OF LOS ANGELES COUNTY <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, The Music Center will provide professional development in arts integration for Micheltorena Street School in the Los Angeles Unified School District. This program focuses on an interdisciplinary approach for all 25 K-5 teachers at the school, gaining skills, strategies and confidence in engaging English Language Learners and exploring world cultures through visual arts.</p>
<p>AIT-19-6052 Arts Integration Training REDWOOD HEIGHTS SCHOOL PARENTS FUND ASSOCIATION <i>Alameda County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Studio Art Program of Redwood Heights Parents' Fund will deepen teachers' capacity to facilitate arts-integrated curriculum and enhance students' creative thinking and making. Faculty will have ongoing opportunities to reconnect with their creativity; deepen use of Studio Habits of Mind and maker-centered projects; engage with artist mentors; develop assessments; and participate in Arts Partners field trips, events, and learning communities.</p>
<p>AIT-19-5654 Arts Integration Training REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AT BERKELEY <i>Alameda County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Cal Performances will develop and offer Workshops for Educators as part of our Cal Performances Classroom program. Led by Master Teaching Artists, the workshops are three-hour "deep dives" into the creative process, giving teachers the skills and knowledge to develop students' artistic literacy by teaching interim lessons between Master Teaching Artist visits, and to prepare students for SchoolTime performances.</p>

<p>AIT-19-5962 Arts Integration Training SAN BENITO COUNTY ARTS COUNCIL <i>San Benito County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the San Benito County Arts Council will offer three half-day Arts Integration Teacher Trainings and one to two additional full-day trainings in partnership with local artists, field experts, the San Benito County Office of Education and the Hollister School District. These workshops will focus on practical, standards-based arts integration methods through topics of 21st Trends in Arts Education, Access and Inclusion, and Design Thinking for the Classroom.</p>
<p>AIT-19-4404 Arts Integration Training SAN DIEGO GUILD OF PUPPETRY <i>San Diego County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the San Diego Guild of Puppetry will present a series of Arts Integration Training, Planning and Coaching sessions for all teachers at Palmer Way Elementary, drawing inspiration and examples from the Guild's puppetry residency program, now in its third year at the site.</p>
<p>AIT-19-5416 Arts Integration Training SANTA BARBARA MUSEUM OF ART <i>Santa Barbara County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Santa Barbara Museum of Art will continue to provide professional development for nine elementary art teachers from the Santa Barbara Unified School District at eight free teacher workshops, two of which will also include secondary school art teachers. These teacher training workshops are in addition to our full program of professional development, which includes educator open houses, online lessons plans, and a digital image bank.</p>
<p>AIT-19-5730 Arts Integration Training STAGEWRITE: BUILDING LITERACY THROUGH THEATRE <i>San Francisco County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, StageWrite will provide in-depth interactive theater workshops for each partner school's staff to build a body of shared knowledge in theater-in-education pedagogy as well as strengthen collaboration between teachers and teaching artists who will partner in residencies. Through experiencing community-building drama activities, teachers learn to integrate theater into the literacy program to bring stories to life in a holistic and meaningful way.</p>
<p>AIT-19-5499 Arts Integration Training WEST CREATIVE PERFORMING ARTS <i>Santa Cruz County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, WEST Creative Performing Arts will work with Martin Luther King School of the Arts Elementary in providing a 20 week job-embedded arts integration program for three (3) Grade 2 teachers. This supports teacher efforts to embed drama-based techniques into K-12 subject area and engages students in core curricular content by connecting student learning to their lived experiences in a manner consistent with authentic instruction principles.</p>

<p>AIT-19-5622 Arts Integration Training YOUNG AUDIENCES OF SAN DIEGO DBA ARTS FOR LEARNING SAN DIEGO <i>San Diego County</i> \$2,500</p>	<p>With the support of the California Arts Council, Arts for Learning San Diego will provide Orientation Workshops for the teaching artists and classroom teachers who are participating in our Title I: Learning Through the Arts (LTA) program. LTA was developed to utilize the arts to narrow the achievement gap and improve academic achievement within 20+ schools in low-income communities.</p>
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
