

Support for arts education projects for youth impacted by or at risk of being engaged in the justice system.

- Application deadline: November 15, 2019
- Maximum request amount: \$50,000
- Planning Grant \$2,500

Reentry Through the Arts

Support for arts projects for formerly incarcerated individuals.

- Application deadline: November 8, 2019
- Maximum request amount: \$50,000
